

Umpires: Guide to Handling Dissent - Players or Spectators -

All umpires follow these guidelines across all leagues

- **A) Consistency really matters:** Even if you're personally fine with a comment, please still address it. Players saying "Sharon didn't pull me up last week" makes life harder for everyone. We all need to be on the same page.
- **B) Quiet Dissent still Counts**: Muttering or under-the-breath comments = still dissent.
- **C) Spectator Comments:** Spectators must NOT comment on umpiring decisions.

If they do, respond with: "Can I remind you that spectators must not comment on umpiring – thank you."

If it continues: Pause play and ask the Team Organiser to speak to them.

PHASE ONE - GENTLE BUT CLEAR

First time a player questions or comments on a call:

Respond with: "GD Please keep your comments to yourself, and remember the code of conduct" (note: there is a printed copy in your Kit Bag)

PHASE TWO - FORMAL WARNING

If commenting continues:

Respond with: "I've already asked for no comments – this is your formal warning."

PHASE THREE - FINAL ACTION

Persistent commenting or aggressive behaviour:

Respond with: "If you'd like to leave the court until you can keep your comments to yourself, feel free to do so." or: "You've ignored my advice twice – this will now be reported to Head Office as a Code of Conduct breach."

You can pause the game, or call Team Organiser in and ask them to remove the player if needed.
